

### Southern Ohio/Kentucky Disaster Ministries Updates

CDS Volunteers Serving – A Children's Disaster Services (CDS) team has been deployed to Guam. Two S. Ohio/KY workers are part of the six-member team. Guam was hit by a typhoon on May 24, the strongest storm to affect the island in 20 years. There was flooding and sustained winds of 140 miles per hour which destroyed and caused damage to homes and buildings. The team has set up a childcare center in a school that is serving as a shelter. This team is serving for three weeks, concluding on July 4. Another team of CDS workers are scheduled to continue the work. Please pray for the CDS workers and disaster survivors.
