About my eyes....chemo caused my oil glands to scar over with no reversal, so eye drops forever to help with the dry eye syndrome, and temporary large, medicated contacts to heal my damaged corneas. As far as being tired....who doesn't like a mid afternoon nap? Thank you for your prayers, love and support. Please don't feel sorry for me. I am handling all of it in a positive way with faith and joy in everyday life.....I just would like you to know how to pray specifically. You've been praying for me for quite some time now, and I thank you! I'm still claiming my miracle of complete healing.


The McMaken Families. Julie Wright and Scott Wright thank everyone for their prayers and concerns.

Hello friends!

The Southern Ohio/Kentucky District Conference is only a couple months away! Your Program and Arrangements Commission has been making plans for an inspirational time of worship, discussion of important issues and fellowship with our brothers and sisters in Southern Ohio and Kentucky. This year's

conference will be held on October 6 & 7 at the West Charleston Church of the Brethren, 4817 St Rt 202, Tipp City, OH 45371.

District Conference is the annual meeting of the district to which delegates from our congregations and others interested participate in business sessions, worship, and fellowship to give implementation to the district purpose. District Conference is the final authority of the district on policy, program and procedure. District Conference must approve the District Budget, elect Board Members, District Conference Officers, members of the Program and Arrangements Committee and various representatives to denominational offices.

Each congregation shall have one vote for each delegate attending District Conference. Each congregation with less than 201 members shall be entitled to four delegates. Larger congregations shall have additional delegates based on current Church of the Brethren practices for allocating additional delegates for Church of the Brethren Annual Conference (each congregation having more than 200 members may send one additional for each 200 or fraction thereof.) The pastor and the leader of the governing board shall be delegates because of their office. A fellowship is entitled to send four voting delegates to District Conference.

We encourage you to attend conference, whether or not you are serving as a delegate. You will be encouraged to know that you are a part of something larger than your local congregation. The fellowship with our sisters and brothers across Southern Ohio and Kentucky is one you will cherish for a lifetime. The West Charleston CoB has graciously offered their campus as a venue for the conference. However, we are inviting, even encouraging, all of you, our friends from across the district, to offer your time and talents to serve as a volunteer during the conference. You will be given the opportunity to volunteer when you complete the registration form.
