


"Princess Pandora" was a special guest for a Pet Therapy Presentation at the December Seniors Alive! Event.

I would like to introduce "Princess Pandora," a 14 year old Pomeranian adopted from the Humane Society of Greater Dayton. She was homeless but not hopeless! At intake it was evident she had been living in a state of neglect. Hair matted and long, nails so grown out, making it hard for her to move around. Groomers were call in. After bathing and much trimming, she sported a Mohawk haircut with a rat tail. - so adorable!

When the adoption counselors brought her in the room it was "love at first sight!" She chose Jim as her human, and it was very clear at this point that she would be spending her golden years with us, where she would be safe and loved.

It became evident soon after adoption that she needed surgery to correct a floating kneecap on her right leg. She had successful surgery at Med Vet followed by 8 weeks of on-site physical therapy and in-home exercises. She made a remarkable recovery! At this point our ministry was about to be revealed: Jer: 29:11 "I know the plans I have for you"

There are many benefits of "Pet Therapy"

- Senior Pets and Senior Adults are often overlooked. "Both" have so much to offer.
- A pet brought into a facility opens up conversation about pets etc.
- Love is offered with a calming effect
- A visiting pet reduces anxiety and loneliness
- Many Senior Residents receive no visitors. The longer someone lives in a facility, visitors can cause them to withdraw and isolate.

Enter Pandora!! She works for "smiles" delivering them one at a time!

As she's going down the hall you can just see the people light up," Nancy said about Pandora. "It's a real ministry. This whole thing has just bloomed into things I could never imagine."

Nancy had a suggestion for anyone looking for a four-legged addition to their family.

"If you're going along in the kennels and you notice an older dog you may want to take a second look. Because it's not really the quantity of life, but the quality of life which is so important," Nancy said."




